is therefore sworn well and truly to fulfill and
execute the same according to law to pay all
just debts legacies and funeral expenses of the
Testatrix and to deliver up the Goods and Effects with
the same and the Receipts and to do all other
things which he shall be lawfully required to do

an accurate account of his acts and proceedings
in the premises when thereunto lawfully required
and to these ends the hoth given pledges namely
Robert Christian of Gordon and William Durrick
