

Whereas Henry Raighin of Sarroisdale
~~in the Parish of St Michael, departed this life on or about~~
 the first day of January 1771 Intestate; leaving behind
 him Five Children, namely John who obtained a settle-
 ment by Marriage Contract bearing date the 10th Jan^y 1768
 of the said Intestates real Estate on Conditions and stipu-
 lations in & Contract set forth; and Joney, Anne, Tho^s
 and Mary Raighin unprovided for by any Deed Contract
 or otherwise; And whereas by the Law of this Land the last
 mentioned Joney, Anne, Thomas and Mary Raighin have
 all a joint equal valent Right to the Intestates Chables and
 Effects, as also to the ^{sum of} Two pounds ten shillings
 which was due unto the Intestate ^{at the time of his death} from his forcs, & Son
 John Raighin which was a part unpaid of the Comodo-
 tion he was to give in lieu of the forcs, & Settlement.

It is therefore hereby agreed upon by the Parties that
 is to say, John Raighin afores, ^{who are all at age} on the one part, and
 Joney, Anne, Tho^s & Mary Raighin afores, on the other
 part, to avoid Contentions & Expenses to come to the following
 Agreement; First that the said John Raighin will pay
 unto his & Brother & Sisters the sum of Six pounds & six shillings
 of the s^d Two pounds ten shillings on Demand, which when
 Received by them shall with the forcs, & Two pounds ten
 shillings be in full of all that could be due unto them by
 the decease of their Father Henry Raighin afores, &
 It is likewise hereby consented that Tho^s Raighin
 shall have all he chooses to accept of his father's shaped

Agreed, and that Mary Raighin agrees, shall have
 the Two Blankets & covered that was on her Father's bed
 at the time of his decease, besides their ^{Dimonds} ~~the~~ of the
 two furs, ~~sums~~ of ~~two~~ pounds, & Two pounds ten shill-
 ings. And for true performance herof, & abiding
 firmly by the contents of it, the Parties concerned
 respectively bind themselves under the Penalty of Twenty
 Pounds. In witness whereof they have caused their
 marks to be affixed to these names this 13th Feb. 1771-
