First She committed her Soul to God and her Body to Christian Burial

Secondly She left and Bequeath to her son W^m Haighin all her right of that Intack that lies between John Lubbocks Garden, & Tho. Craines Garden, & she also left her said son two pewter Dishes, a Cupboard and Chair in lieu of twenty shillings that her said son W^m had given at the Death of his father

Thirdly She left & bequeath unto her Daughter Mary Addy her cloak, a black & white Gown, a petticoat, two black hudds, & half of her best head close

Fourthly She left & bequeath unto her Daughter Ann Haighin the feather bed & bed close that she lay on at the making of this Will, she also left unto her said Daughter a little wheel, two Gowns, a petticoat, bed Gown, Checque apron, & the other half of her best head close

Fifthly She left & bequeath unto her Daughter in law Mary Haighin all the remainder of her Wearing Apparel of what kindsoever save & except a Coat she left unto her son Henry Quay

Lastly she constituted nominated and appointed her said
son Henry Quay whole and sole Executor of all the
rest of her effects movables & Immovable of what kind
& nature so ever including & Debarring all other person
or persons claiming or pretending any right in her
effects with six pence Legacy
