Margret Cannel my Clothes with the two pewter  
Dishes with the twenty Shillings Legacy to  
her grand Daughter Jane Cannel

4<sup>ly</sup> I Leave and bequeath unto my son  
Charles Haighins a Blanket and  
a Coverlet

5<sup>ly</sup> I leave and bequeath unto my Daughter  
Catherine Haighins the best Cow

Lastly I ordain nominate and appoint  
My two Daughters Ann and Catherine  
Heir & sole Exec<sup>rs</sup> of all the rest  
of my goods moveable and Immoveable  
of what kind or nature soever, give  
and bequeath unto any one that will  
claim to this my last will and Testament  
one Shilling As Legacy
